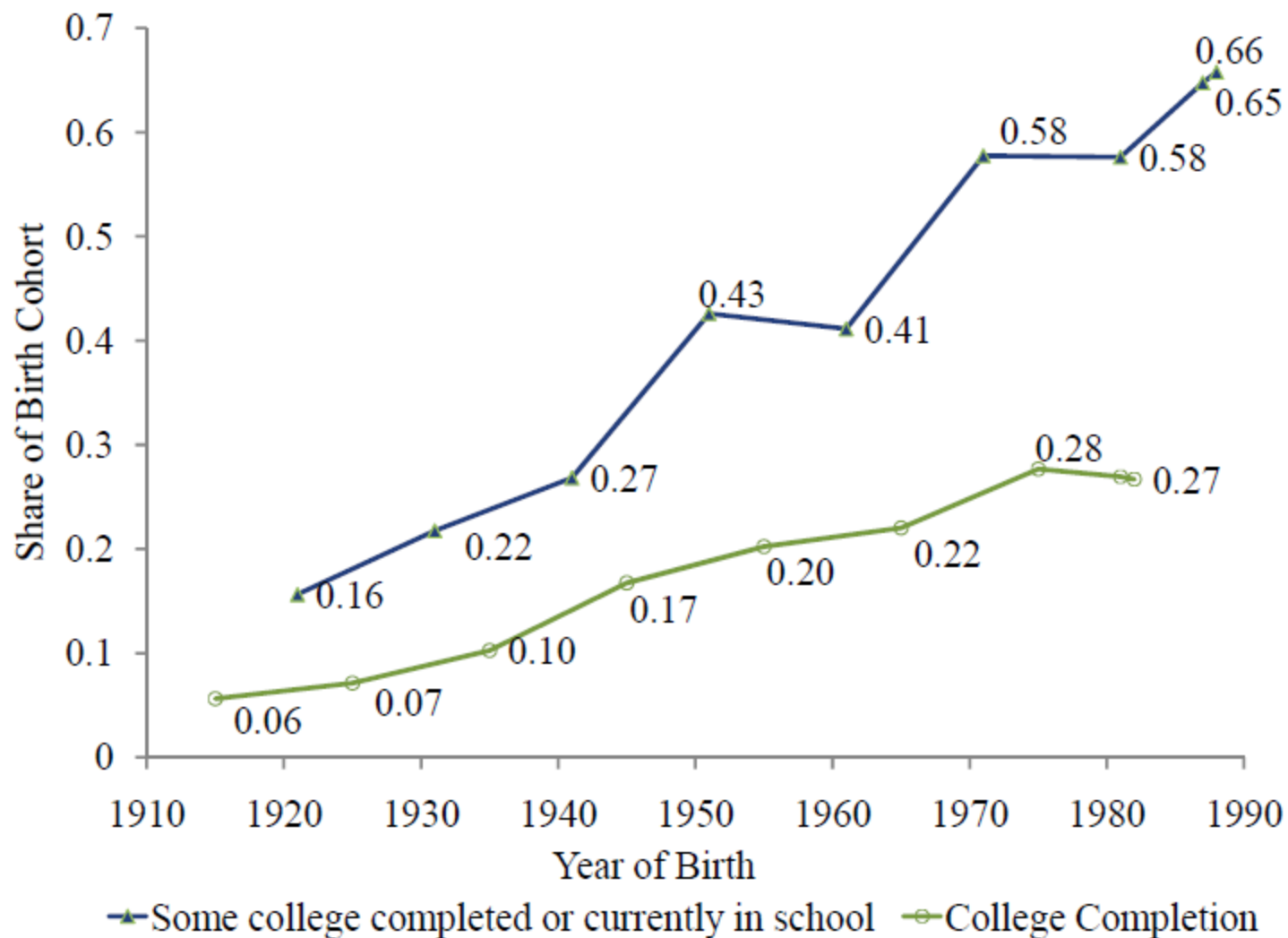

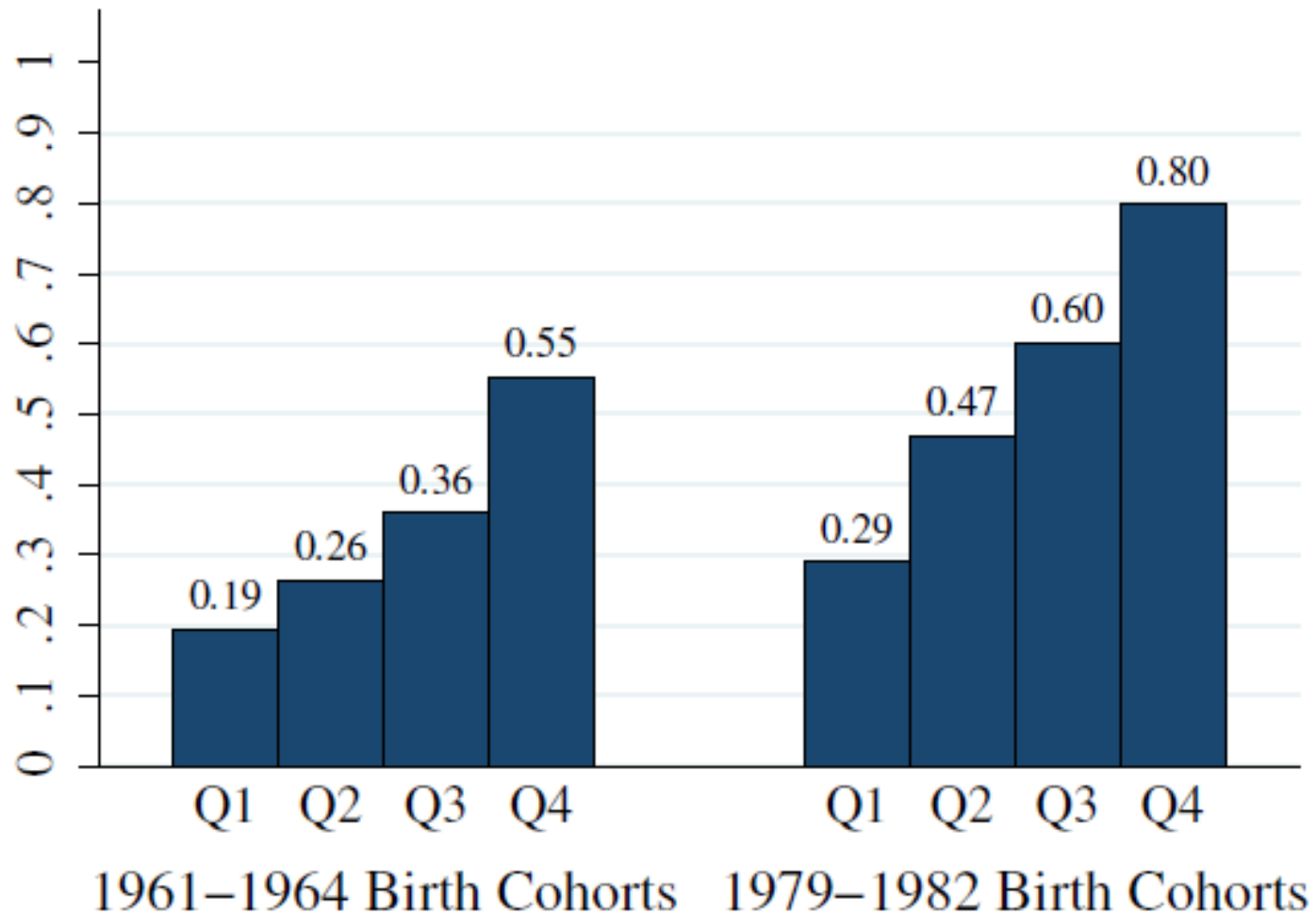


Figure 6: College Entry, Completion, and Persistence, by Income Quartile

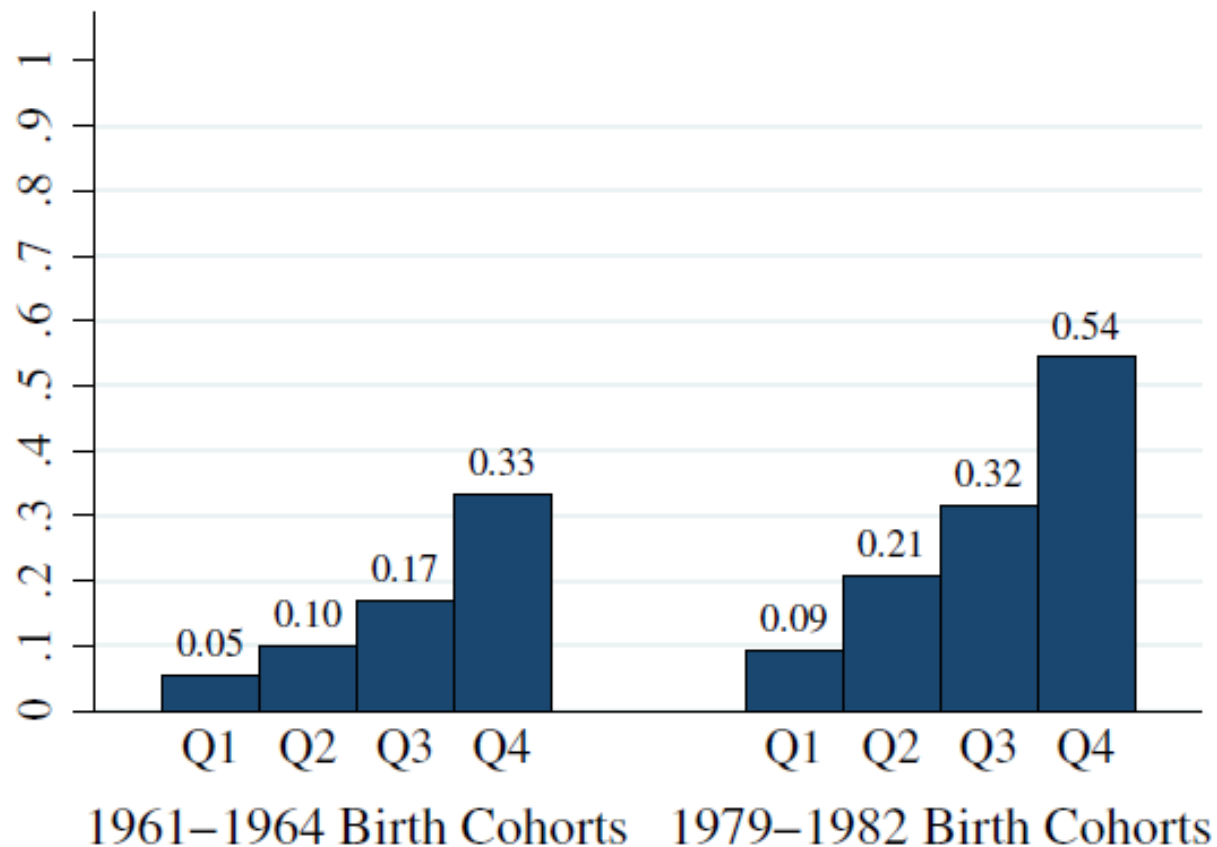
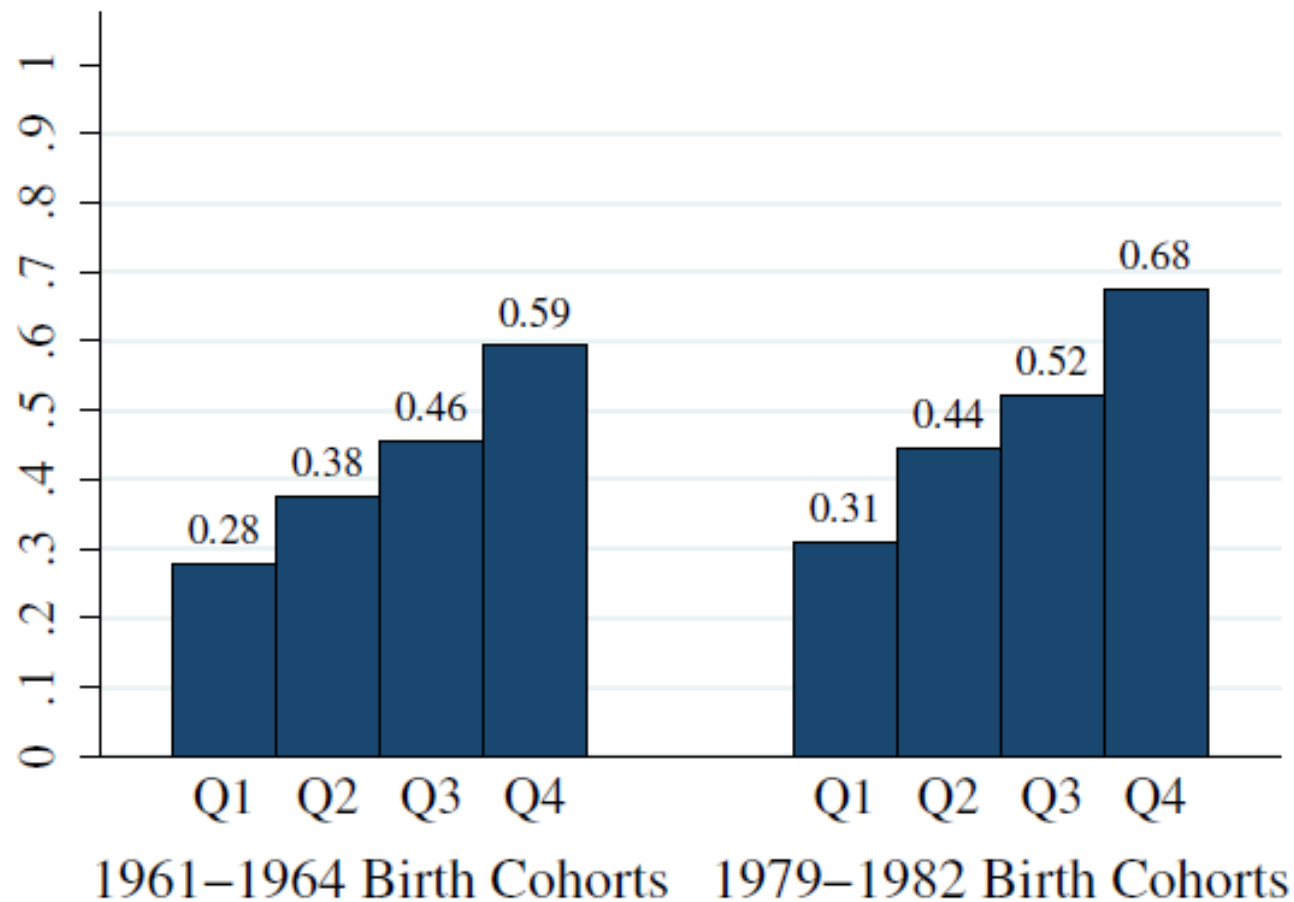


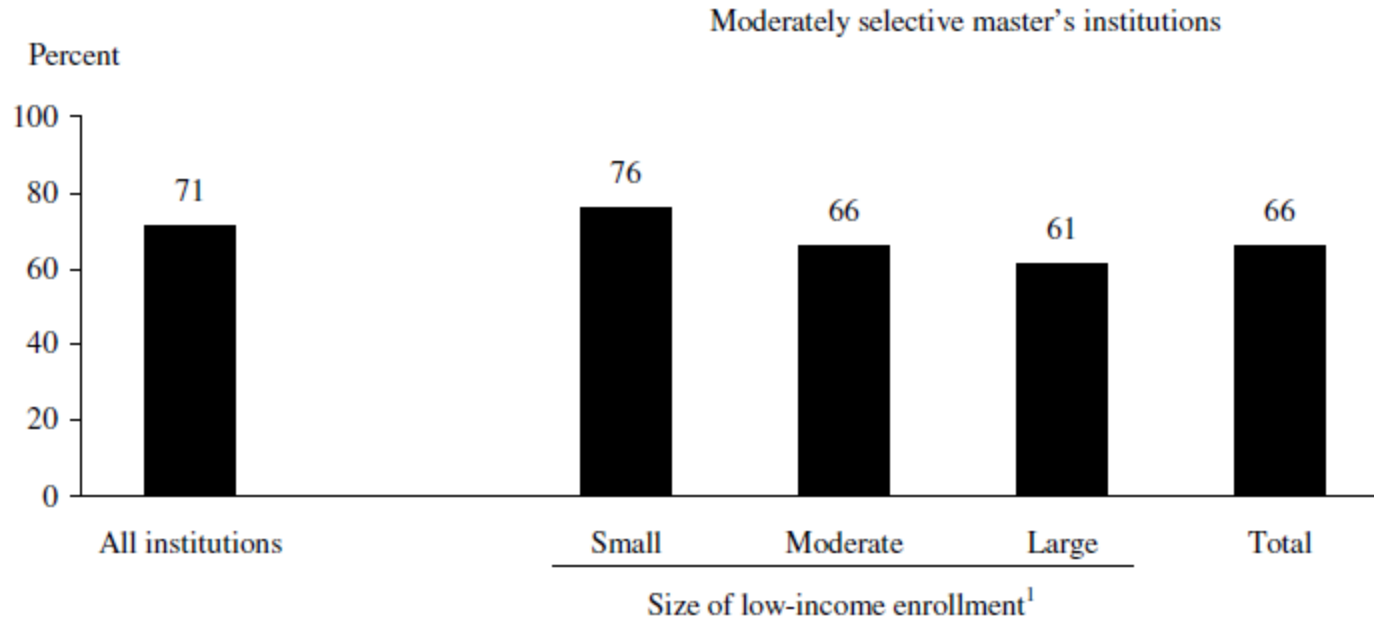
Figure 6: College Entry, Completion, and Persistence, by Income Quartile

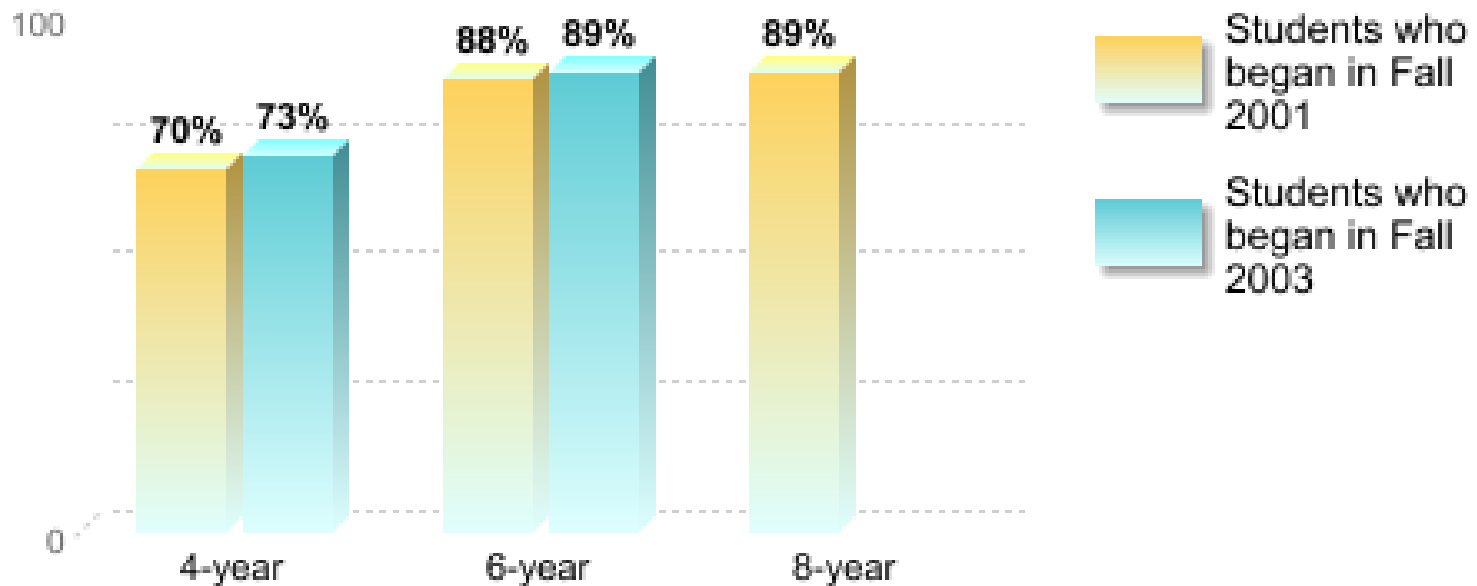

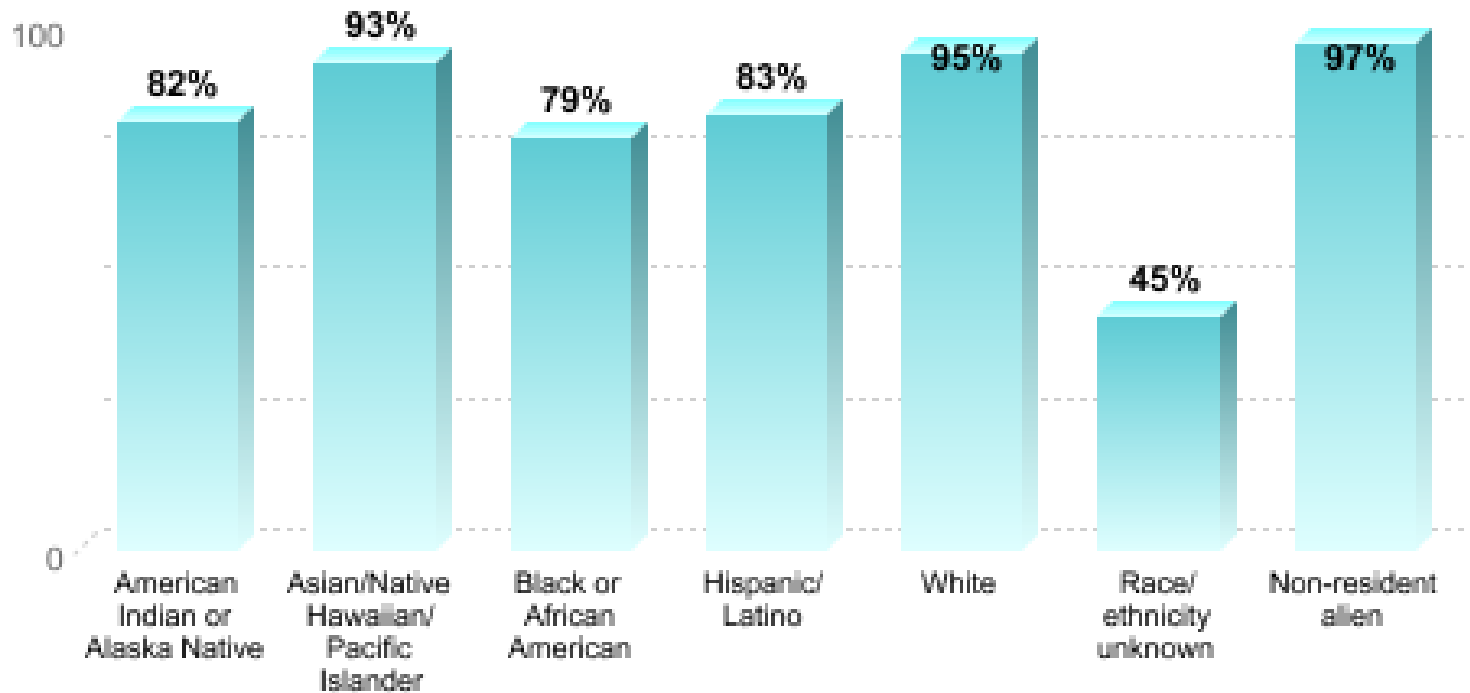
## GRADUATION RATES FOR STUDENTS PURSUING BACHELOR'S DEGREES

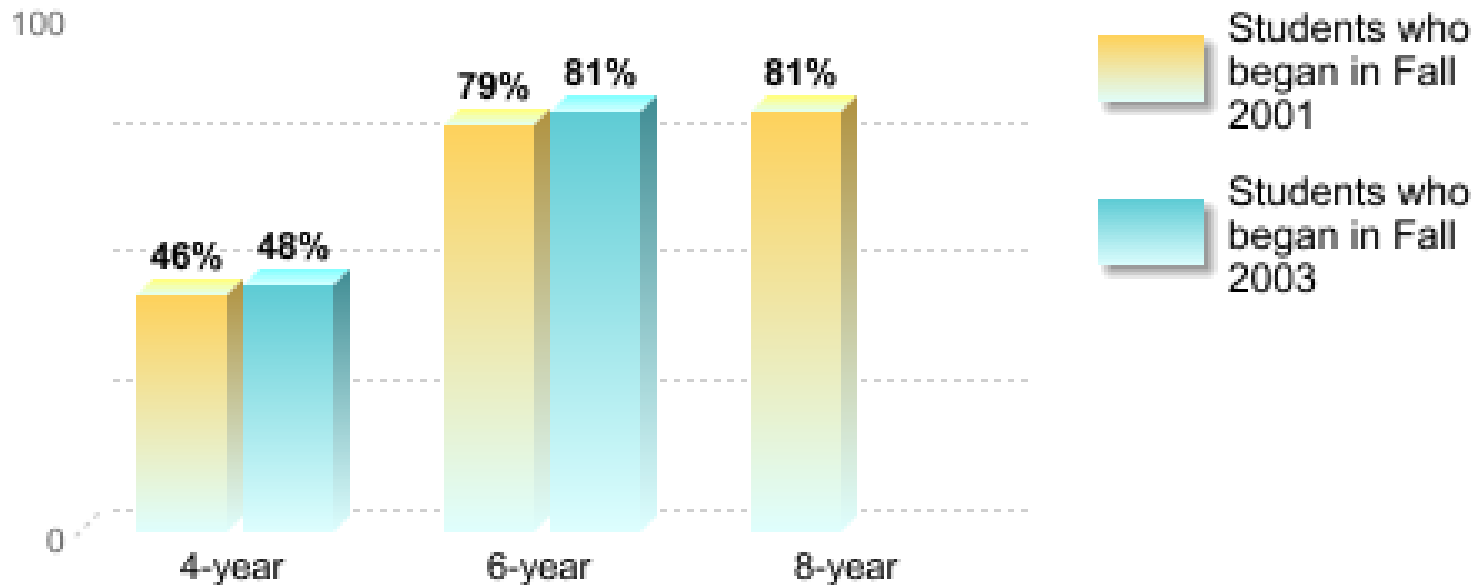

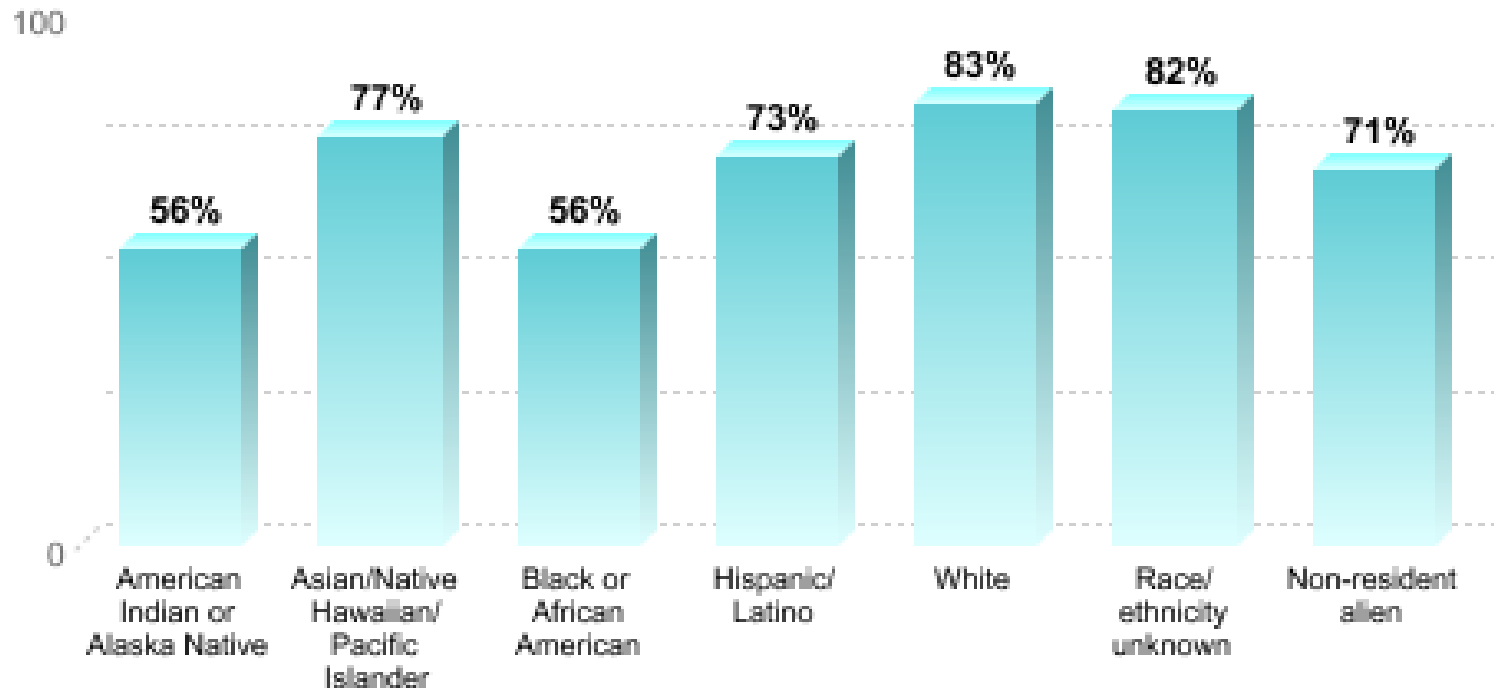
## GRADUATION RATES FOR STUDENTS PURSUING BACHELOR'S DEGREES
